Housing Task Force to Hold Housing Summit

The Tri-State Development Housing Task Force will hold a 2012 Housing Summit on Thursday, June 7, 2012 on the campus of Culver Stockton College. The Task Force invites individuals currently involved and interested in the housing industry to attend. They will join elected officials and business/industry leaders for a day of dialogue about housing issues the tri-state region faces including resources, shortfalls and opportunities.
